## Notice of Hearing

March 28, 2012

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) will hold a hearing in March to consider the request by Health Canada's National Dosimetry Services (NDS) to review an order issued to NDS by a Designated Officer and to amend the existing dosimetry services licence. NDS is located in Ottawa, Ontario.

A Designated Officer Order was issued on February 23, 2012 requiring that NDS immediately cease reporting extremity doses, provide evidence that appropriate processes have been put in place to ensure no further inadvertent extremity dose reporting would occur, and await CNSC authorization to restart the service. NDS requests the Order to be revoked. NDS also requested an amendment to its dosimetry services licence to reference in the licence the newly developed and implemented procedures for verification of the performance of the dosimetry system and the corrective action plan.

The Commission has determined that a public hearing is not necessary to consider NDS's request in this case. The hearing will be conducted by way of written submissions from CNSC staff and NDS.

Following the deliberations and decision of the Commission on this matter, a *Record of Proceedings, including Reasons for Decision* will be published on the CNSC Web site and made available to the public.
