## Notice of Hearing

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) will hold a hearing in August to consider an approval request made by Atomic Energy of Canada Limited (AECL) for the Chalk River Laboratories (CRL) within the municipality of Chalk River, Ontario.

AECL has requested the Commission's approval to decommission the Plutonium Tower (Building 223) at CRL. The first part of decommissioning the Plutonium Tower consists of the removal of the annexes and services to building, and is expected to be completed by 2013. The second part of the project consists of the removal of the concrete tower, soil remediation and associated activities, and will occur after a period of continued storage with surveillance. The removal of the tower and site remediation is planned to be completed by 2028.

The Commission will consider AECL's application by way of written submissions, in a closed session. CNSC staff recommendation and AECL's application letter will be available as of July 11, 2012 by contacting the Secretariat at the address below.

Members of the public who have an interest or expertise in this matter or information that may be useful to the Commission in coming to a decision are invited to comment, in writing only, on AECL's application. Requests to intervene must be filed with the Secretary of the Commission by August 10, 2012, directly on-line at

http://www.nuclearsafety.gc.ca/eng/commission/intervention/index.cfm or at the coordinates below. The request must include the following information, as per the *Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission Rules of Procedure*:

- a written submission of the comments to be presented to the Commission; and
