## ERRATUM

### Ontario Power Generation Inc.

#### Application to Renew the Power Reactor Operating Licence for the Darlington Nuclear Generating Station

Following a hearing on December 3 to 6, 2012, the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC), pursuant to section 24 of the *Nuclear Safety and Control Act*<sup>1</sup>, renewed the power reactor operating licence issued to Ontario Power Generation (OPG) for its Darlington Nuclear Generating Station (Darlington NGS). The licence is valid for a period of 22 months, from March 1, 2013 until December 31, 2014.

The following correction is made to the English version of the *Record of Proceedings* document issued on February 26, 2013 by the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission, pertaining to the application to renew the power reactor operating licence for the Darlington NGS.

On page 45 of the document, paragraph 225, the sentence

“The Commission includes in the licence a condition requiring that OPG ensure that the emergency plans of various levels of government, including Provincial and Municipal, are integrated and implemented in a manner satisfactory to the CNSC.”

is changed to

“The Commission directs OPG to file with the Commission a report detailing all the emergency plans that would be deployed in case of a nuclear emergency, both on and off the Darlington Nuclear site, identifying the authority responsible for its application and describing how the various plans are integrated. OPG shall present this information to CNSC staff in sufficient time as to be part of the next annual progress update on the CNSC Fukushima Action Plan, which is planned for August 2013, at the same time as the annual performance report on nuclear power reactors in Canada.”
