Notice of Hearing

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) will hold a hearing in March 2015 to consider an application from Canadian Light Source Incorporated (CLSI) for a change of address for its particle accelerator operating licence and to allow the processing of nuclear substances at its facility. CLSI is located in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan.

CLSI operates a Class IB synchrotron facility located on the University of Saskatchewan campus, and has recently constructed a nuclear substance laboratory for the processing of unsealed nuclear substances. This activity is not covered by CLSI's current licence and, although the proposed activities are low-risk, an amendment to this licence requires authorization from the Commission.

The Commission has determined that a public hearing is not necessary to consider this request from CLSI. The requested changes are administrative in nature and do not raise matters related to health, safety or environmental protection that would warrant being considered in the context of a public hearing. The hearing will be conducted by way of written submissions from CNSC staff and CLSI.

Following the deliberations in a closed session and decision of the Commission on this matter, a record of proceedings, including reasons for decision, will be published on the CNSC website and made available to the public.
