Pickering NGS: Request for Exemption from Class I Nuclear Facilities Regulations

The purpose of this letter is to request, pursuant to Section 7 of the *Nuclear Safety Control Act* and Section 11 of the *General Nuclear Safety Control Regulations*, that the Commission grant an exemption from Section 9(4) of the *Class I Nuclear Facilities Regulations*. If the Commission grants this exemption, OPG subsequently requests the 6-month extension of personnel certifications that will expire in 2020 at the Pickering NGS.

Section 9(4) of the *Class I Nuclear Facilities Regulations* states that certifications issued by the Commission expire five years after the date of issuance or renewal.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the compensatory actions that OPG has undertaken to secure the reliable and safe operation of its facilities, we have postponed the conduct of the Requalification Testing program for up to six months, thus putting personnel certifications in jeopardy of expiring.

OPG requests that the Commission grant an exemption to Section 9(4) of the *Class I Nuclear Facilities Regulations*, and grant a 6-month extension to the current certification expiry dates for the four (4) Pickering NGS staff identified in Attachment 1. This will help ensure a sufficient number of certified staff for minimum complement requirements and allow OPG to maximize nuclear safety during this time of crisis.

Each of the staff identified in Attachment 1:

- (a) has safely and competently performed the duties of the position for which they are certified at the Pickering NGS;
- (b) continues to receive the applicable training referred to in the Pickering Nuclear Power Reactor Operating Licence, PROL 48.01/2028;
- (c) has successfully completed at least one of the two types of requalification tests referred to in PROL 48.00/2028, for renewing a certification; and
- (d) is capable, in my opinion, of performing the duties of position for which they are certified at Pickering NGS.

A complete record of each person's performance in the continuing training and the requalification testing program is available upon request.

OPG will conduct each outstanding requalification test during the amended period of certification, and will submit renewal applications for the staff identified in Attachment 1, once such tests are successfully completed.

We request that, if the Commission grants this exemption, that the CNSC issue the 6month extensions to the current certifications as soon as possible.
