On behalf of the Justice, Peace, and Integrity of Creation Office of the Sisters of St. Vincent de Paul, I request to intervene in the hearing in the above-referenced matter at Peterborough. By this letter, and pursuant to the CNSC's *Rules of Procedure* ("Rules"), I request status to participate as an intervenor in the public hearing and an opportunity to present oral submissions.

As JPIC's lead on climate change and environmental justice issues, I am deeply concerned with planning for and adapting to the warming climate we are already experiencing. This must be a priority for every business, every municipality, and every community. That means we must cast a fresh eye on proposals and developments that pose a health risk to communities. I believe this proposal's inherent risks may be compounded by the impacts of climate change.

As I just today learned about the public hearing process, I ask to be recognized as an intervenor and given the opportunity speak at the public hearings in Peterborough, so that I may present my research into how a warming climate in Central Ontario may intensify the risk's associated with this license renewal, accompanied by a written report.
