Overview

VIM is a large, long-term investment in the PHCF site:

- Removal of up to 150,000 cubic metres of inherited waste materials, including some soil excavation
- Removal of some of the Conversion Facility's surplus buildings

- Refurbishment of buildings to improve the look and efficiency of the site
- Installation of flood
 protection barriers
 that will also provide
 radiation, noise and
 visual shielding along the
 eastern fenceline
- Improvements to storm water management infrastructure
- Shifting of the fence line at the south end of the facility 16 metres to the north

Removal of up to 150,000 m³ of waste materials



Key Progress

Significant progress has been made over the past two years...

To-date, about 22,000 cubic metres have been removed as part of the work completed.

First shipment of historic waste to LTWMF

All wastes stored at the Centre Pier transferred to the LTWMF

JANUARY 2019

Repackaging of accumulated waste at Dorset Street and main site

Cameco completes demolition of Centre Pier buildings

Cameco vacates Centre Pier



Impacts of Covid-19

Suspended nonessential VIM work to limit the amount of contractors on site in mid-March 2020

Cameco suspended shipments to LTWMF mid-March 2020

LTWMF resumed operations in July 2020







Waste Management

- Inventory of over 35,000 drums of accumulated legacy waste that was primarily stored at two CNSC licensed warehouse locations
- June 20, 2018
 First shipment of waste to LTWMF

Since the LTWMF opened we have shipped 114 Quatrex totes, 3,200 Super Sacs and 2,349 drums. Total volume of ~9,200 cubic meters.



Original VIM Illustration




Revised VIM Illustration
