1.0 BACKGROUND

Cameco is one of the largest global providers of the uranium fuel needed to energize a clean-air world. Utilities around the world rely on our nuclear fuel products to generate safe, reliable, emissions-free nuclear power. Together, we are meeting the ever-increasing demand for clean, baseload electricity while delivering energy solutions to support the world's net-zero goals.

We have interests in tier-one mining and milling operations that have the licensed capacity to produce more than 30 million pounds (our share) of uranium concentrates annually, backed by more than 464 million pounds (our share) of proven and probable mineral reserves. We are also a leading supplier of uranium refining, conversion and fuel manufacturing services.

For over 30 years, Cameco has been working to develop long-term relationships to build the trust and support of northern Saskatchewan communities. We believe that Indigenous communities should benefit from resource development on or near their traditional lands.

To guide our engagement, Cameco has developed a five-pillar strategy to provide communities with capacity building, and employment and business development opportunities for sustaining relationships within our operating areas. These five pillars are as follows:

- Workforce development
- Business development
- Community investment
- Environmental stewardship; and
- Community engagement.

Cameco has collaboration agreements in place that formalize these relationships with the communities in the specific areas in which we operate in northern Saskatchewan that are based on these five pillars. These agreements allow us to collaboratively determine the focus areas based on a community's unique needs. Through these agreements, we aim to optimize benefits to the community giving more certainty around investment and local business opportunities while enhancing long-lasting relationships.

2.0 SELF-ASSESSMENT

Cameco's self-assessment is based on the criteria outlined in REGDOC 3.2.2., which articulates that the requirements of the REGDOC do not apply to licence renewals with no proposed changes to existing operations as authorized by the Commission. Cameco's 2021 application and revised November 2022 letter is to renew the McArthur River and Key Lake licences for a period of 20-years with no change to the authorized activities. In accordance with this application, Cameco's licence renewal would not result in any

potential new or additional adverse impacts on the Indigenous or treaty rights of the Indigenous primary target audiences for these operations as described in the McArthur River and Key Lake Public Information Programs and as identified in Section 5, and, as such, the requirements of REGDOC-3.2.2 are not triggered.

3.0 SCOPE

Specific to the 20-year licence renewal for McArthur River and Key Lake, this document is voluntary and designed to follow the guidance provided in the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission's (CNSC) REGDOC 3.2.2, Indigenous Engagement.

4.0 ENGAGEMENT PRINCIPLES

Cameco's overall public engagement process is guided by a set of principles that were developed through roundtable consultation with northern opinion leaders. These principles are as follows:

• Open Channels for Communication

Cameco should engage with all northerners through various groups including political leadership, youth and Elders and at all stages of activities from exploration to decommissioning – with the goal of building understanding and acting upon concerns.

Make it Simple

Cameco should provide information simply and clearly in plain language avoiding technical language so lay people can understand the issues involved and provide meaningful comment.

• Build Capacity for Understanding

Cameco needs to find ways to assist in further building capacity of northern people to understand technical issues related to uranium mining operations and are able to share information with community members about these activities.

Hear the Elders

Cameco recognizes the special stature of Elders in First Nation and Métis culture and should consult with Elders while building their understanding of the uranium mining industry.

Include Youth

Youth represent the future for northern Saskatchewan. Cameco should support youth and enhance their understanding of the uranium mining industry, along with the opportunities and impacts involved.

• Speak and Hear Our Languages

In order to meaningfully engage northern people, Cameco should be able to both provide information and receive comments in traditional aboriginal languages.

These principles guide Cameco's communication and engagement efforts in northern Saskatchewan

5.0 IDENTIFICATION OF INDIGENOUS GROUPS

As set out in our Public Information Programs, the primary audience and focus of engagement for McArthur River and Key Lake is the rights-bearing First Nation and Métis communities in the vicinity of the operations. Specifically, these communities are:

- the Northern Village of Pinehouse
- the Kineepik Métis Local Inc. #9
- English River First Nation (ERFN)
- Lac La Ronge Indian Band (LLRIB)

Cameco has worked with the local communities for many years and, with the signing of Collaboration agreements, reaffirms and formalizes these long-standing relationships. In June 2012, Cameco and Orano Canada Inc. (Orano) signed collaboration agreements with the Northern Village of Pinehouse and the Kineepik Métis Local Inc. #9 (Pinehouse) and ERFN in May 2013. Cameco also signed a collaboration agreement with the LLRIB in June 2017. These agreements are the primary agreements with the communities associated with the McArthur River and Key Lake operations that build on a historic relationship as well as commercial relationships with businesses owned by these communities.

The community engagement and environmental stewardship pillar of these agreements defines Cameco's obligations in relation to engaging and informing the communities and provides a structure for the community to identify and bring forward issues related to the licensed activities at McArthur River and Key Lake.

Engagement between Cameco and the communities under these agreements occurs primarily through an established subcommittee that includes members of the local community, Pinehouse Joint Engagement Subcommittee (JIES), ERFN Joint Engagement and Environmental Subcommittee (JIEES), and the Traditional Lands and Resource Advisory Committee (LLRIB). Under these agreements, a joint committee of community and industry representatives meets regularly to discuss operational and environment-related matters of importance to the respective communities and provides a channel for the communities to share traditional knowledge with the company. We discuss all aspects of our business on traditional territories, from exploration activities to decommissioning.

In addition to engaging with the Métis people in the vicinity of our operations through an agreement, Cameco also works with the Métis Local President #82 in Patuanak. Cameco continues to focus our engagement on those in the local vicinity of the operation but does

provide information and responds to the Métis Nation of Saskatchewan if there is an expressed interest.

Cameco employees at McArthur River and Key Lake, of which approximately half are residents of northern Saskatchewan, and long-term contractors at these operations are also part of the primary target audience.

While the rights-bearing First Nation and Métis communities in the vicinity of the operations are the primary audience for McArthur River and Key Lake, Cameco considers the general public of the Northern Administrative District (NAD) and the province of Saskatchewan generally to be a secondary audience. The NAD is a large region (approximately the size of Germany) with a dispersed population and many traditional and resource-based land users. The population of the NAD is approximately 36,500, including people of First Nation (Cree and Dene), Métis and non-Indigenous origin.

Cameco provides information and responds to inquiries from the NAD communities, organizations and groups that may express interest in our operations through our websites and social media channels and direct engagement when appropriate.

In June 2016, Cameco and Orano Canada Inc. (Orano) signed a collaboration agreement with the Athabasca Basin communities known as the Ya'thi Néné Collaboration Agreement. Specifically, these communities are:

- Black Lake Denesuline First Nation.
- Fond du Lac Denesuline First Nation.
- Hatchet Lake Denesuline First Nation.
- Northern Settlement of Camsell Portage.
- Northern Hamlet of Stony Rapids.
- Northern Settlement of Uranium City.
- Northern Settlement of Wollaston Lake

This agreement builds on the Impact Management Agreement signed between Cameco, Orano and these communities in 1999. Engagement between Cameco and the communities under this agreement occurs primarily through the Athabasca Joint Engagement and Environment Subcommittee (AJES), previously the Athabasca Working Group. The Ya'thi Néné Lands and Resource office was established to provide support to the subcommittee and the executive director is an AJES member. Also, the office has become a point of contact for the communities. Pursuant to the agreement, a process for engagement was developed to both update the communities and to ensure a clear understanding of Cameco's operations and activities. Cameco will continue to engage this established group under the agreement.

In addition, Cameco engages with the Northern Saskatchewan Environmental Quality Committee (NSEQC), which was established pursuant to a recommendation of the Joint Federal-Provincial Panel on Uranium Developments in 1997 to foster better communication between northerners, the government and the uranium mining industry. There are representatives from 32 northern municipal and First Nation communities on the

NSEQC. The Saskatchewan Northern Mines Monitoring Secretariat (NMMS) co-ordinates the activities of the NSEQC that may include site visits, workshops and liaisons with other jurisdictions. Members of the NSEQC are appointed by the provincial government through the NMMS, based on recommendations from community leaders. Members that visit uranium mining operations in the Basin are encouraged to report back to their communities and the larger NSEQC.

6.0 ENGAGEMENT METHODS

Cameco uses a variety of well-developed tools to communicate information as set out in our public disclosure protocol, that stems from the public information program. While traditional media and evolving social media formats are used, the heart of Cameco's engagement efforts in northern Saskatchewan continues to be through face-to-face engagement.

The current global pandemic continues to persist and disrupt the daily lives of northern communities and Cameco continued to adapt our communication tools to ensure the health and safety of all participants.

The communication tools listed below have been employed throughout the licence term and continue to be incorporated into Cameco's ongoing engagement activities for the Rabbit Lake operation.

- Site tours on request from formal committees and educational institutions.
- Meetings and workshops (virtual and in-person) in northern communities.
 - o Hands on classroom demonstrations
- Meetings with community leadership and membership.
- Responding to general inquiries and ad hoc interactions with northern communities

- Supporting and increasing accessibility for northerners through Cameco satellite offices
- Incorporating visual aids videos and virtual tours.
- Providing Dene and Cree translations

Cameco will continue to strive to build strong relationships in the north through our public information program and our commitment to maintaining open channels of communication with all interested and potentially interested parties.

7.0 SUMMARY OF INDIGENOUS ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES TO DATE

In April 2021, Cameco applied to the CNSC to begin the process to renew the licences for the McArthur River and Key Lake operations. Cameco is requesting 20-year licence terms, and the hearing is scheduled to be held in June 2023. The current licences are valid until October 31, 2023.

Specific to the licence renewal, Cameco engaged with the local communities, Indigenous groups, and other interested groups early in the relicensing process. Cameco also continued to provide information related to the operations and worked to address questions raised with respect to performance (e.g., environmental protection, radiation protection, and the health and safety of the workforce). This engagement began with formal meetings with the primary and secondary target audiences, informing them of the upcoming licensing activity, providing links to relevant information on Cameco's northern website, and advising of the opportunities for participation and inviting them to contact Cameco for further information. During these activities, discussions focused predominately on agreement benefits, namely, employment, investment and business opportunities.

With respect to licence term, we continued to hear uncertainty expressed by the communities regarding Cameco's original request for indefinite licence terms and how they would fit within the existing regulatory and engagement framework. In November 2022, in response to the feedback received, Cameco revised our original request and asked for the licences to be renewed by the CNSC for a 20-year term.

In addition to our formal engagement, Cameco also maintains a presence in northern Saskatchewan through our Sustainability and Stakeholder Relations Department that has satellite offices in Black Lake, Fond du Lac, Hatchet Lake, Pinehouse and ERFN. Cameco has designated the manager, community and Indigenous engagement as the representative for the McArthur River and Key Lake operations for Indigenous engagement. The respective site general managers and site staff, in addition to the corporate Safety, Health, Environment and Quality Department, provide the consistent technical support for all engagement activities related to the operation.

8.0 PLANNED INDIGENOUS ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

Cameco strives to proactively engage Indigenous communities in a variety of ways to provide information, to elicit feedback and to respond meaningfully. Cameco recognizes and respects the rights and related interests of Indigenous communities and works to establish open dialogue to ensure any issues or concerns can be addressed appropriately. To continue working towards open dialogue and fostering meaningful relationships, Cameco is planning the following engagement activities:

- Collaboration Agreement Subcommittee Meetings
 - o Cameco will continue to meet with the agreement subcommittees quarterly (or as needed) as defined through the process outlined in the agreements.
- Community Meetings
 - o Cameco will host meetings with Indigenous groups as identified in Section 5, to continue to provide information directly to the local Indigenous communities.
 - o Community meetings were held in November 2022 and January 2023.
- Correspondence (via email)
 - o Cameco will send correspondence to Indigenous groups following the receipt of PFP funding, as follow-up to their application.
 - Correspondence will look to provide more information about the licence application, learn about the respective Indigenous group's interests, offer to meet with Indigenous groups and will respond to questions or concerns.
- Site Tours:
 - o Site tours will be offered and coordinated upon request.
 - o JIES toured the McArthur River operation in June 2022.
 - o JIEES toured the Key Lake operation in September 2022.
 - JIES, LLRIB Committee and NSEQC representatives toured the Key Lake operation in October 2022.
- Cameco Relicensing Website
 - o Cameco will continue to provide information on the licence renewal, program summaries and other related information on the Cameco North website.

9.0 PROPOSED INTERIM REPORTING SCHEDULE

Cameco will keep the CNSC informed of our Indigenous engagement in support of McArthur River and Key Lake's 20-year licence renewals in verbal updates provided during CNSC Staff and Cameco joint meetings.

10.0 MATERIAL CHANGE UPDATES TO THE INDIGENOUS ENAGEMENT REPORT

As noted earlier in the document, the McArthur River and Key Lake licence renewal requests do not trigger the requirements of RD-3.2.2, and this report is being submitted voluntarily by Cameco. As such, there is no requirement to provide updates regarding changes to the activities noted in this report.
