

To ensure impacts to the environment and the health of our members are limited to the extent possible


To provide conditions of approval for MSIFN's <u>consent</u> for continued operations on the Darlington Waste Management Facility

Our community has history of practicing harvesting rights and recreational activities in Darlington.




Importance of Consent


MSIFN is seeking a consent-based approach

The Crown to obtain the free, prior and informed consent (FPIC) of First Nations for all Crown decisions related to nuclear facilities

Article 32(2) of UNDRIP states that "the Crown shall consult and cooperate with Indigenous Peoples to obtain FPIC prior to approval of any project affecting our lands and territories particularly in connection with development of resources"







Conditions

Consent: OPG to secure MSIFN's consent for the DWMF before proceeding with project activities

Collaborative planning process: Related to safety, current and future site plans, and on-site environmental restoration.

OPG Offsite Restoration Fund: Restoration of shorelines along Lake Ontario

OPG – MSIFN Collaboration to Review International Best Practices: For the management and storage of used nuclear fuel with DWMF's practices
