Commission Ruling on Request to Protect Confidential Information

Requestor: Lac La Ronge Indian Band

Matter: 25-H9 — Application for a Licence to Prepare Site and Construct the Wheeler

River Project

Proceeding: Two-Part Public Hearing in October and December 2025

With respect to the matter noted above, the Commission has considered Lac La Ronge Indian Band's <u>request for confidentiality</u>¹ for the document set out in Table 1, below. This request was made pursuant to rule 12 of the <u>Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission Rules of Procedure</u> (the *Rules*).

The Commission's ruling on this request, for the purposes of this proceeding, is also documented in Table 1 and relates only to Lac La Ronge Indian Band's written submission.

The Commission is satisfied that:

- as per subrule 12(1)(b) of the Rules, the document in Table 1 contains Indigenous
 Knowledge that is consistently treated as confidential; and
- as per subrules 12(2)(a) and 12(2)(b) of the Rules, protection of the information outweighs in importance the public interest in public hearings and disclosure of evidence, and the measure taken is designed so as not to affect the public nature of the proceeding except to the extent necessary to adequately protect the information.

Therefore, applying subrules 12(3)(b) and 12(3)(c) of the *Rules*, the Commission orders that the publication or disclosure of information given to the Commission in document 1 be prohibited, as described in Table 1.
