Designated Officer Program Update: 2024 (CMD 25-M22.A)

CNSC Designated Officer Program

<u>Section 37</u> of the <u>Nuclear Safety and Control Act</u> (NSCA) gives the Commission the authority to designate DOs

- CNSC DOs are designated by title of office
- DO authorities include decisions on licensing, certification, and enforcement

The CNSC DO Program provides training and resources that:

- Allow for consistency in issuing and tracking DO certificates
- Support DOs in making independent, effective, consistent, and transparent decisions
- Support informing CNSC staff and reporting to the Commission


The DO Program exists to support DOs and the Commission

DO Positions at the CNSC

37 DO positions at the CNSC

- DOs are issued a certificate setting out their duties
- DO authorities are not transferable
- DOs in management positions can carry out the DO authorities of all DO positions that report to them

DO Authorities Carried Out in 2024

Total of 3,350 DO decisions

- 636 certifications of prescribed equipment and persons
- 990 issuances of a license
- **1,673** renewed, amended, revoked, and transferred licences
- 36 designations of inspectors
- 1 designation of an analyst
- 1 DO order (regarding licence condition about the financial guarantee)
- 7 confirmations of inspector orders
- 6 Administrative Monetary Penalties

Decisions Reportable to the Commission (1/2)

The NSCA specifies DO decisions that must be reported to the Commission

Report to Commission

37(5) A designated officer shall report to the Commission on

- (a) a refusal by the designated officer to issue, renew, suspend, amend, revoke or replace a licence or authorize its transfer;
- **(b)** the issuance by the designated officer of a licence that contains the condition that the applicant provide a financial guarantee referred to in subsection 24(5);
- (c) a renewal of a licence where the terms or conditions of the licence are amended, or a suspension, amendment, revocation or replacement of a licence, other than an amendment of terms or conditions or a suspension, amendment, revocation or replacement made on the application, or with the consent, of the licensee; and
- (d) a confirmation, amendment, revocation or replacement of an order under paragraph (2)(g).

- One of 4 divisions within the Directorate of Nuclear Substance Regulation
- Responsible for:
 - Licensing and compliance of Class II facilities/equipment
 - Certification of Radiation Safety Officers (RSO)
- Class II Nuclear Facilities and Prescribed Equipment Regulations





ACFD DOs are the ACFD Director, 3 Senior Project Officers DO authorities:

All ACFD DOs:

- Issue a licence
- Renew, suspend, amend, revoke, replace, or authorize a transfer

Director only:

- Certify and decertify persons referred to in paragraph
 44(1)(k) as qualified to carry out their duties
- Make any order that an inspector may make under subsection 35(1) or (2)
- Confirm, amend, revoke or replace any order made by an inspector

4 DOs in ACFD can make licensing decisions

Licensing decisions made by ACFD DOs

- Issuance of construction, operation, decommissioning of Class II equipment or facilities
- Revocations when the licensee is ready to move to the next licensing phase
- Servicing of Class II prescribed equipment
- Transfers when a legal entity changes

DO Focus Area – ACFD (5/8)

A DO considers a range of information for decisions related to licensing actions:

- Licensee history
- Safety case of the request
- Technical assessment of the programs
- Results of previous inspection

DO must be satisfied that licensees are qualified and will make adequate provision for the protection of the environment, the health and safety of persons

DO Focus Area – ACFD (6/8)

DO considers a range of information for a decision related to the certification of a person:

- Candidate qualifications
- Type of facility
- Results of examination

One DO in ACFD, the ACFD director, makes certification decisions

DO must be satisfied that the person is capable of performing the duties of the position




DO Focus Area – ACFD (8/8)

Trends

Medical sector licensing decisions are **61% of the decisions** made in 2024 but **44% of licences**

- Medical licences typically list many pieces of equipment and require many amendments when equipment is changed
- Ongoing issuance of lifecycle licences will reduce number of decisions made in the medical sector





- In 2024, CNSC DOs carried out 3,350 authorities
- 98 decisions were reportable to the Commission
- Centralized DO Program enhances and strengthens support to DOs

The DO Program is a key and effective component of the CNSC's licensing and compliance framework



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Summary of Designated Officer Authorities

Summary of DO Authorities (1/2)

Licensing and certification authorities pursuant to the NSCA

- 37(2)(a): certify and decertify prescribed equipment for the purposes of the NSCA
- **37(2)(b):** certify and decertify persons referred to in paragraph 44(1)(k) as qualified to carry out their duties under the NSCA or the duties of their employment, as the case may be
- **37(2)(c):** issue, on receipt of an application referred to in subsection 24(2), a licence of a class established by the Commission
- **37(2)(d):** renew, suspend in whole or in part, amend, revoke or replace, or authorize the transfer of, upon receipt of an application referred to in subsection 24(2), a licence of a class established by the Commission



Designation and compliance (non-licensing and certification) authorities, pursuant to the NSCA

- 37(2)(e): designate any person whom the designated officer considers qualified as an analyst under section 28 or as an inspector under subsection 29(1)
- 37(2)(f): make any order that an inspector may make under subsection 35(1) or (2)
- 37(2)(g): confirm, amend, revoke or replace any order made by an inspector
- 37(2)(h): authorize the return to work of persons whose dose of radiation has or may have exceeded the prescribed radiation dose limits
- 65.05: issue notices of violation (related to administrative monetary penalties)



DO Program Overview

DO Qualifications and Training

- Self-directed learning using the internal DO Community Webpage
- Briefing with the VP-LCAB or designate on applicable legislation, DO decision-making, DO authorities and DO certificate
- Briefing with the DO Program lead on DO training activities, tools and resources available to DO when carrying out DO authorities
- On-the-job coaching, peer consultations, learning of operational matters
- In-class training on DO orders

3,299 licensing and certification authorities carried out in 2024 including

- 1,629 decisions made by DNSR DOs
 - 148 licences issued
 - 363 licences renewed
 - 813 licences amended
 - 132 licences revoked
 - 99 licences transferred
 - 56 prescribed equipment certificates granted
 - 18 personnel certificates granted
- 1,098 decisions made by DSS DOs
 - 842 licences issued
 - 256 licences amended or revoked
- 562 personnel certificates granted by DSM DOs
- 7 licences renewed or amended by DERPA DO
- 3 licences renewed or amended by DNCFR DO

Section 65.05 of the NSCA allows the issuance AMPs to an individual or a corporation

• Up to \$20,000 for individuals and up to \$100,000 for corporations

DO Orders

Paragraph 37(2)(f) allows authorized DOs to make orders

Orders made by a DO must be referred to the Commission






Number of DO Authorities by Directorate: 2024 vs Previous Years
