CNSC to conduct a hearing in writing on Ontario Power Generation’s application to change the integrated implementation plan for Darlington Nuclear Generating Station

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) will conduct a public hearing based on written submissions in summer 2026. The hearing in writing is to consider an application from Ontario Power Generation (OPG) for changes to the integrated implementation plan (IIP) for the [Darlington Nuclear Generating Station](#) (Darlington NGS). The Darlington NGS is in the municipality of Clarington on the traditional lands and waters of the Michi Saagiig Anishinaabeg, the Gunshot Treaty (1787–88), the Williams Treaties (1923), and the Williams Treaties Settlement Agreement (2018). **This revised notice of hearing in writing is issued to amend the dates for the filing of submissions. The submission by CNSC staff will now be available after April 30, 2026. Interventions must now be filed by June 30, 2026.**

The Darlington NGS has 4 CANDU pressurized heavy water reactors. The current licence authorizes OPG to operate the Darlington NGS and is valid until November 30, 2045. The IIP is part of the licensing basis under the [Nuclear Safety and Control Act](#), and any changes in the licensing basis require the Commission’s authorization. The IIP includes actions from the environmental assessment and the integrated safety review that OPG completed in support of the refurbishment and continued operation of the Darlington NGS. OPG is proposing to expand the scope and extend the timelines of 2 IIP items – the aquatic thermal study and the aquatic impingement and entrainment study – and to add a task to the latter for a study on best available technology economically achievable.

Hearing submissions

The Commission will consider written submissions from OPG, CNSC staff and intervenors. The Commission will then deliberate and render a decision on this matter, after which a record of decision will be published on the CNSC website and made available on request to the Commission Registry. A decision from the Commission is anticipated in **summer 2026**.

Interventions

Requests to intervene must be filed with the Commission Registry by **June 30, 2026** by using the [online request form](#), emailing the Registry at interventions@cnscccsn.gc.ca, or using the contact information below. **The request to intervene must include the following information:**

- A written submission of the comments to be presented to the Commission, including an appendix with all documents mentioned as references in the written submission
- The requester's name, address, telephone number and email address

All submissions will be available for download on the CNSC website at cnscccsn.gc.ca or upon request to the Commission Registry. Personal information, such as address and telephone number, is essential for linking the submission to its author. If you wish to ensure the confidentiality of your personal information, please submit it on a separate page.

Obligation for providing documentary material for the record

Under rule 15 of the Rules, any documentary evidence, written submission or other material filed with the Commission shall be open to the participants and the public (subject to any confidentiality measures taken by the Commission, as described below).
