**Subject: Letter of Support for Bruce Power's Licensing Basis Update for Hot Cell Operation at CMF**

Dear Secretary of Commission,

We are writing to express our support for Bruce Power's request to update its licensing basis to include the construction and operation of a hot cell at the Central Maintenance Facility (CMF) at the Bruce Power site.

A hot cell is a small, enclosed workspace used to safely handle radioactive materials. This equipment is essential for safely processing lutetium-177, a medical isotope used in cancer treatment. The proposed hot cell will allow Bruce Power to remove target carrier materials, safely extract the quartz ampule containing irradiated lutetium-177 and ship it directly to its international partner, ITM in Munich, Germany. Currently, this work is completed offsite. Relocating it to the Bruce Power site will improve logistics, reduce emissions and enhance safety for workers and the public. It will also strengthen the medical isotope supply chain and create jobs in Bruce County and Saugeen Ojibway Nation (SON) Territory.

Our nations have a mutually beneficial partnership with Bruce Power in the production and marketing of lutetium-177. Revenue from this partnership directly supports community programs and economic development. Expanding the isotope value chain through onsite hot cell operations strengthens this partnership and enhances our role in the global fight against cancer.

We urge the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission to approve Bruce Power's request, as it aligns with our shared commitment to safety, innovation and Indigenous economic participation in the nuclear sector.
