Commission Ruling on Request to Protect Confidential Information

Requestor: Bruce Power

Subject: 26-H110, Application to Amend the Licensing Basis for the Bruce A and B Nuclear Generating Stations for Lutetium-177 Processing

Proceeding: Hearing in Writing – July 2026

Where the Commission grants the request for confidentiality as detailed in Table 1, the Commission is satisfied that:

- protecting the information outweighs in importance the public interest in public hearings and disclosure of evidence [see subrule 12(2)(a)]
- the measures are designed so as not to affect the public nature of the proceeding except to the extent necessary to adequately protect the information [see subrule 12(2)(b)]

Therefore, the Commission orders that the measures described in Table 1 be taken to maintain confidentiality.

Where the Commission denies the request for confidentiality as detailed in Table 1, in addition to the reasons provided in Table 1, the Commission also refuses the request because:

- the public interest in public hearings and disclosure of evidence outweighs the reasons given for the request to protect the information [see subrule 12(2)(a)]
- Therefore, the documents in question are not protected by confidentiality measures and **will form part of the public record** unless Bruce Power withdraws the documents from the record by communicating with the Commission Registry before **August 12, 2026**.

As of **August 13, 2026**, any documents for which confidentiality has not been granted will be included in the public record for this proceeding.
