



Commission Decision on Designated Officer (DO) Positions

Subject/	Update of DO Positions and Duties within the Regulatory Operations Branch
Matters for decision/	The Commission, pursuant to subsection 37(1) of the Nuclear Safety and Control Act , was to decide whether to change designated positions and authorized duties for designated officers (DOs), reflecting recent organizational changes at the CNSC.
Decision/	The Commission designated 4 new positions, by title of office, as DOs, with duties as set out in Table 1 of CMD 26-H113. The Commission also removed the designation for 2 positions. The Commission designates the following positions by title of office: • Vice-President, Power Reactor and Nuclear Substance Regulation • Vice-President, Advanced Reactor Technology and Nuclear Facility Regulation • Director, Darlington Regulatory Program Division – Darlington New Nuclear Project • Operations Manager, Accelerators and Class II Facilities Division The following positions are no longer designated: • Executive Vice-President and Chief Regulatory Operations Officer, Regulatory Operations Branch • One (1) Senior Project Officer, Accelerators and Class II Facilities Division
Reasons for Decision/	The Commission is satisfied that any person appointed to the 4 designated positions is qualified as a DO, and that the authorized duties are commensurate with the necessary duties associated with the positions. These changes ensure the continuity of operations. With the designation of the 4 new positions, the designation of the 2 removed positions is no longer required.



Direction/

With this decision, the Commission directs the Commission Registry to:

- provide certificates to the persons in the 4 new designated positions setting out the duties that they are authorized to carry out
- revoke the certificates issued to the persons in the positions that are no longer designated
- update the Matrix for DO positions and authorities, in accordance with this decision
