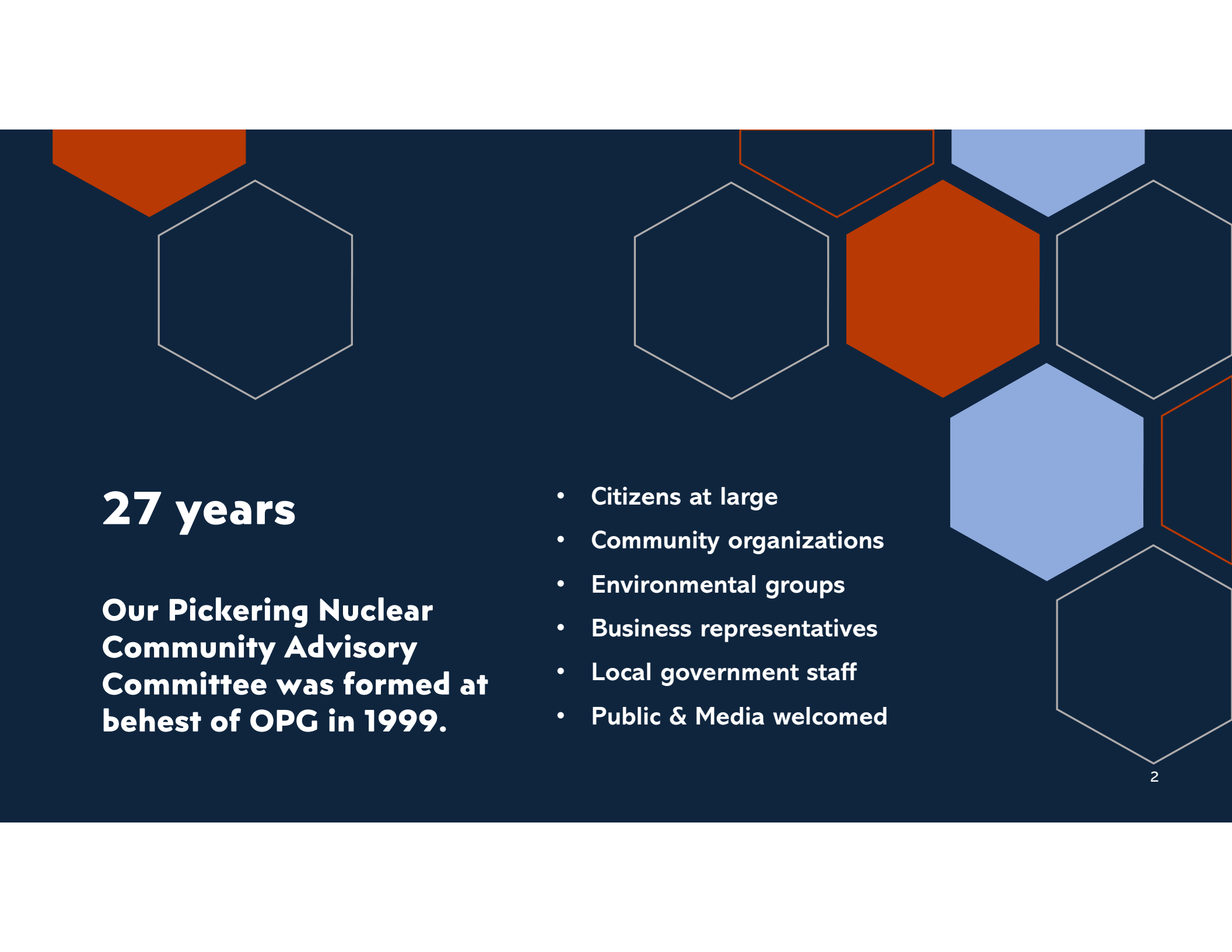

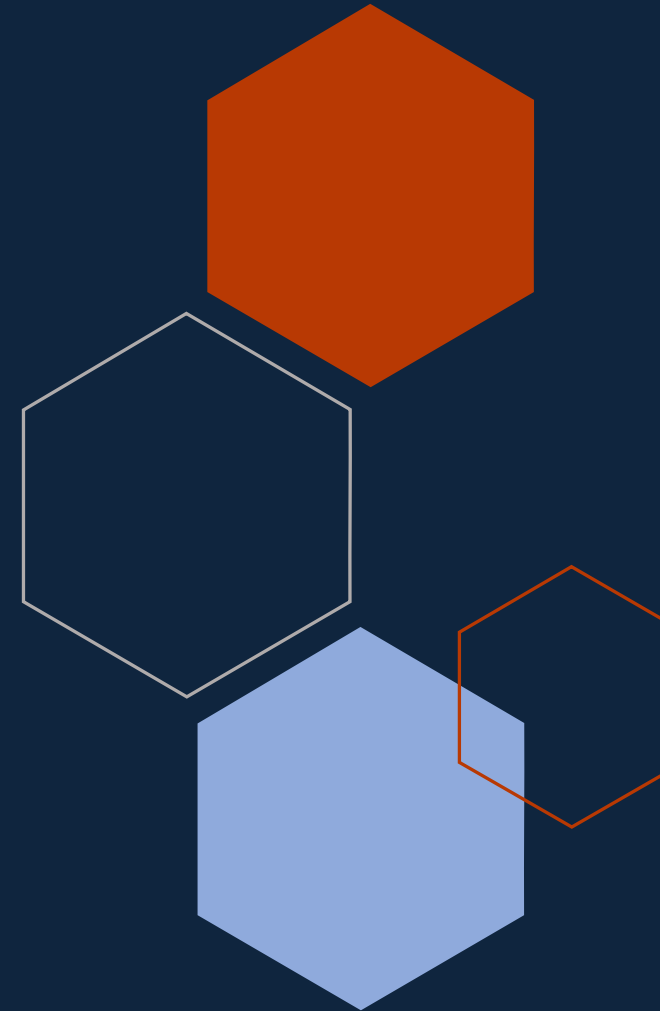

- Reviewed the Renewal Application for Pickering Nuclear Generating Station (PNGS) Power Reactor Operating Licence and Pickering Waste Management Facility (PWMF) Operating Licence
- CAC member and intervention facilitator attended Pickering Nuclear Generating Station Licensing Workshop where additional questions were answered
- Met independently of OPG at ad hoc meeting to determine intervention of support for the application and a second time to finalize the wording of our intervention
