On behalf of 369 Global, I am writing to express our support for Ontario Power Generation's (OPG) application to renew the Pickering NGS's Power Reactor Operating Licence (PROL) and the Pickering Waste Facility Operating Licence (WFOL) for a 10-year term from January 1, 2027 to December 31, 2036. We understand that during this term, OPG plans to refurbish Units 5 to 8 to support continued operations for 30-plus years and progress the decommissioning of Units 1 to 4.

Pickering Nuclear plays an important role in providing clean, safe, reliable, and low-cost electricity to the Province of Ontario. The refurbishment of Pickering NGS will allow Units 5 to 8 to continue to provide a significant portion of the Provincial energy supply, maintain and secure thousands of highly skilled jobs, and generate a significant increase in Ontario's GDP over the project's lifespan, including \$17 billion during the refurbishment phase.

We believe that OPG will continue to make public safety their top priority during the refurbishment project, and when it's complete, operate the plant to the highest safety standards. They continue to maintain open and transparent communications with organizations like ours, and the community at large. OPG also strives to make a difference in the community by creating strong partnerships and relationships.

Through our operations in the Regional Municipality of Durham, where Pickering Nuclear is located, we have actively engaged with municipalities, joined local chambers of commerce, and supported the work of several not-for-profits serving communities across the region through our Community Investment and Partnership Engagement Program (CIPEP). We see the refurbishment and continued operating of Pickering Nuclear leading to the creation of more safe, clean energy jobs in the region while serving the electricity needs of Ontario.

With this in mind, we are pleased to support the license renewal request.
