Our family has a history with CNL or AECL as it was formerly called. My dad was a loyal employee for 32 years. He started as a labourer after the war, studied and became an operator. The CEO was Fred Blackstein. He was approachable and treated all employees with respect and was open to their opinions.

Since the new consortium took over I have seen young and old valued employees have to leave the company because of the changes happening at work. This used to be a place that would hire local people and keep them. Many are taking early retirement because the future with this group looks bleak. They feel unheard as employees.

The big three companies' managers are looking to a 6, 2 and 2 license and they many will retire and what will happen to us the Valley people. Will we be left with the waste and the buildings. I have heard they are outsourcing the IT now. Are these new IT people being scrutinized. The whole thing is a little scary for me.

I think a license for two years with strict stipulations.

All my life people have asked me for advice. Where do I send my child to University? How do I do my resume? And other things.

I have worked in the teaching profession.

When I see some of Pembroke and Petawawa people leaving it upsets. One young fellow had his blackberry taken away from him. He was in the IT department.

It is hard to explain but my gut tells me this consortium needs strict controls by the government and a short reign. Until they have a proper President and CEO they need to be watched closely. My gut is usually right.
