



Notice of Opportunity to be Heard

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) is providing Bruce Power and Ontario Power Generation (OPG) with an opportunity to be heard regarding the designated officer orders issued on July 26, 2021 for the [Bruce Nuclear Generating Station](#) (NGS), and on July 27, 2021 for the [Darlington NGS](#) and the [Pickering NGS](#). The orders require Bruce Power and OPG to obtain authorization from the Commission prior to the restart of designated units following any outage that results in the cooldown of the heat transport system.

Pursuant to subsection 37(6) of the [Nuclear Safety and Control Act](#), the designated officer referred the orders to the Commission for review to confirm, amend, revoke or replace the orders. The purpose of the opportunity to be heard is to allow the Commission to consider relevant information and evidence that will result in an informed decision.

The Commission is proceeding with the opportunity to be heard in accordance with the [Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission Rules of Procedure](#). The Commission will consider the orders and submissions from Bruce Power and OPG. There is no opportunity for the public to intervene on this matter.

Bruce Power's submission, OPG's submission and CNSC staff's recommendations to be considered at the hearing will be available on the [CNSC website](#), or on request to the Secretariat, after September 1, 2021.

The public is invited to observe the proceeding. The opportunity to be heard on the designated officer orders will be [webcast live](#) and available for 90 days on the [CNSC website](#).

Following the deliberations and decision of the Commission on this matter, records of decision will be published on the CNSC website and made available to the public on request.
