Upcoming public meeting on the Regulatory Oversight Report for Canadian Nuclear Power Generating Sites: 2018

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) will hold a public meeting in November 2019 where CNSC staff will present the *Regulatory Oversight Report for Canadian Nuclear Power Generating Sites: 2018* (ROR). This report will provide CNSC staff's assessment of the Canadian nuclear power industry's safety performance during the 2018 calendar year, and will also provide limited updates regarding certain developments in 2019. The ROR will cover the assessment of performance of both the nuclear power plants and the waste management facilities located at the nuclear power generating sites.

The purpose of the funding is to assist Indigenous peoples, members of the public and stakeholders in reviewing CNSC staff's ROR and participating in the Commission meeting process by providing topic-specific submissions to the Commission. The draft ROR will be available for review on the CNSC website, or on request to the Secretariat, after **September 6, 2019**.

Persons who have an interest or expertise in this matter are invited to comment on the ROR in writing by **October 7, 2019** using the <u>online request form</u> or the contact information below. The submission must include your name, address and telephone number. In addition, the CNSC will allow Indigenous intervenors the opportunity to make oral presentations in the spirit of reconciliation and in recognition of the Indigenous oral tradition for sharing knowledge.
