Revised Notice of Hearing in Writing

Revision 1

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) will conduct a hearing based on written submissions in spring 2021 to consider an application from Bruce Power for a temporary exemption from sections 23.1.2(2) and 23.2.1 of <u>REGDOC-2.2.3</u>, <u>Personnel Certification</u>, <u>Volume III: Certification of Persons Working at Nuclear Power Plants</u>. Bruce Power is requesting that the Commission authorize alternative requirements for minimum experience and general training for the initial certification of personnel who were previously certified at an Ontario Power Generation CANDU nuclear power plant (NPP) and have been hired into the initial certification program at Bruce Power. This revised notice is to announce a change allowing Indigenous peoples, members of the public and stakeholders to file a written submission. This change is the result of interest expressed by various organizations to participate in this hearing.

The current licence requires Bruce Power to implement and maintain certification programs in accordance with CNSC REGDOC-2.2.3, Volume III. Bruce Power is requesting a temporary exemption from sections 23.1.2(2) and 23.2.1 and seeking authorization for the following alternative requirements:

- that reactor operators previously certified at an NPP of the same type have six months of additional plant experience at the NPP where certification is sought, instead of at least one year
- that the completion of general training at an Ontario Power Generation NPP be transferrable to the NPP where certification is sought

Pursuant to rule 3 of the *Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission Rules of Procedure* (the Rules), the Commission has decided to vary the Rules in order to ensure that this hearing is dealt with as informally and expeditiously as the circumstances and the considerations of fairness permit. The Commission will consider written submissions from the licensee and CNSC staff, as well as written interventions from members of the public, Indigenous groups and stakeholders. A panel of the Commission will then deliberate and render a decision on Bruce Power's application.

The hearing submissions from the <u>licensee</u> and <u>CNSC staff</u> are available on the <u>CNSC website</u>, or on request to the Secretariat.

Pursuant to rule 19, persons who have an interest or expertise in this matter or information that may be useful to the Commission in coming to a decision are invited to comment, in writing, on Bruce Power's application. Requests to intervene must be filed with the Commission Secretariat by May 31, 2021, using the online request form or the contact information below. The request to intervene must include the following information:



- a written submission of the comments to be presented to the Commission
- the requester's name, address, telephone number and email address

All submissions will be available for download on the <u>CNSC website</u> or on request to the Secretariat. Personal information, such as address and telephone number, is essential for linking the submission to its author. If you wish to ensure the confidentiality of your personal information, please submit it on a separate page.

Following the deliberations and Commission decision on this matter, a record of decision will be published on the CNSC website at <u>nuclearsafety.gc.ca</u> and made available on request.
