

Notice of Hearing in Writing

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) will conduct a hearing in February 2019, based on written submissions, to consider an application from Nordion (Canada) Inc. (Nordion) to transfer its Nuclear Substance Processing Facility Operating Licence (NSPFOL). Nordion has applied to transfer its NSPFOL to a successor corporation resulting from the amalgamation of Nordion, its direct parent company, and two other non-licensee affiliated companies. The Nordion facility is located in Kanata, Ontario.

Nordion's NSPFOL authorizes it to process medical isotopes and gamma technologies for use in healthcare and industrial applications. The amalgamated corporation was assigned a new corporate number, but retained the current corporate name of Nordion (Canada) Inc., address, personnel and ultimate owners. The amalgamation and licence transfer will not result in any changes to Nordion's licensed activities or licence conditions.

Pursuant to rule 3 of the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission Rules of Procedure (the Rules), the Commission has decided to vary the Rules in order to ensure that this hearing is dealt with as informally and expeditiously as the circumstances and the considerations of fairness permit. The Commission will consider written submissions from Nordion and CNSC staff. A panel of the Commission will then deliberate and render a decision on Nordion's application.
