Upcoming public meeting to update on the discovery of elevated hydrogen equivalent concentrations in the pressure tubes of reactors in extended operation

The <u>Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission</u> (CNSC) will hold a public meeting in November 2022. At this meeting, CNSC staff will update the Commission on the discovery of elevated hydrogen equivalent (H_{eq}) concentrations in the <u>pressure tubes</u> of reactors in extended operation. The reactors covered by the update are located in the traditional and treaty territories of many Indigenous Nations and communities. **This revised notice is to announce the exact date for this presentation and the location of the public meeting.**

In July 2021, Bruce Power informed the CNSC that measurements obtained from Bruce Nuclear Generating Station Units 3 and 6 showed an H_{eq} concentration in exceedance of the licence limit of 120 parts per million. CNSC staff took <u>regulatory action</u> requiring Bruce Power, Ontario Power Generation and New Brunswick Power to report on pressure tube fitness for service and any other measures taken in response to this event. The Commission held a meeting in <u>September 2021</u> to discuss the matter. A subsequent discovery at the inlet of a Bruce Unit 6 pressure tube was <u>reported</u> to the Commission during its meeting in March 2022.

At the November 2022 Commission public meeting, CNSC staff will provide an update of the assessment of the licensees' H_{eq} work to date. The update will cover reactors at the Bruce Nuclear Generating Stations, Pickering Nuclear Generating Station B, the Darlington Nuclear Generating Station, and the Point Lepreau Nuclear Generating Station. During the meeting, the licensees will also present their research and development plans to address the impact of H_{eq} findings on the pressure tubes' fitness for service. The Commission will also hear from its External Advisory Committee on Pressure Tubes.
