



STATUS OF THE DESIGNATED OFFICER PROGRAM: 2017 and 2018

CMD 19-M25

The Designated Officer (DO) Program (DO Program) was established in 2000 with the coming into force of the *Nuclear Safety and Control Act* (NSCA).

- The Commission designates certain CNSC staff in senior positions to have statutory powers and carry out authorities under the NSCA
- DOs carry out lower risk licensing, certification and compliance decisions
 - Compliance decisions include those related to orders and Administrative Monetary Penalties (AMPs)
 - Certification decisions include those related to prescribed equipment and personnel

Like the Commission, DOs make decisions independently.


Importance of procedural fairness considerations

DO Positions at the CNSC (1/3)

Number of DO Positions by Directorate



In 2014, the Commission designated **31 DO positions**

- 22 DO positions in the Regulatory Operations Branch (ROB)
- 9 DO positions in Technical Support Branch (TSB)




DO Positions at the CNSC (2/3)

Pyramid-style allocation of DO authorities

- Authorities are allocated according to position and operational responsibilities
- Ensures continuity of operations

DO authorities are not transferable





DO Positions at the CNSC (3/3)

Retirements and new appointments in DO positions resulted in:

- 7 DO position staffing changes in 2017
- 8 DO position staffing changes in 2018

All new DOs completed the DO training and assistance program which includes legal and procedural briefings, self-directed learning and peer mentorship

Following a CNSC reorganization in 2018, the Commission approved the replacement of the DO position of **Director**, **Nuclear Reactors and Research Reactors Division** with the **Director**, **Canadian Nuclear Laboratories Regulatory Program Division** position

The DO Program helps ensure that all DOs are well equipped to carry out their authorities



DOs may carry out authorities under 37(2) and 65.05 of the NSCA

- Authorities are limited to the scope of a position; Commission authorizes these statutory powers
 - include licensing, personnel and equipment certification, inspector designations, return to work authorizations, and compliance (i.e. orders, notices of violation)
 - summary of authorities is provided in Appendix A
 - summary of Commission-designated DO positions and their authorities is available in Appendix B

Applicants and licensees may appeal a DO decision to the Commission

- Statutory requirement for an opportunity to be heard for certain DO decisions
 - must be offered in cases such as licence refusals or revocations

DOs may be authorized to carry out licensing, certification and compliance authorities



DO Authorities Carried Out – 2018 (2/3)

3,390 licensing and certification authorities in 2018 including:

- 1,862 authorities by DNSR
 - 152 licences issued
 - 337 licences renewed
 - 920 licence amendments
 - 237 licence revocations
 - 89 licence transfers
 - 93 prescribed equipment
 - 34 personnel certifications
- 609 personnel certification authorities by DSM
- 910 authorities by the DSS
 - 780 licences issued
 - 130 licences amended, revoked or transferred



DO Authorities Carried Out – 2018 (3/3)

As in 2017, the majority of authorities were carried out by :

- The Directorate of Nuclear Substance Regulation (DNSR)
- The Directorate of Safety Management (DSM)
- The Directorate of Security and Safeguards (DSS)

The other four directorates with DOs carried out an additional **21** authorities



Decisions Reportable to the Commission

DOs must report to the Commission on certain decisions that they make pursuant to subsection 37(5) of the NSCA

- Licensing refusals
 - including refusals to issue, renew, suspend, amend, revoke or replace a licence, or authorize its transfer
- Issuance of a licence with a financial guarantee
- Licence renewal with a change in licence conditions, or a licence suspension, amendment, revocation or replacement without an application or the licensee's consent
- Confirmation, amendment, revocation or replacement of an inspector's order

DO decisions reportable to the Commission pursuant to subsection 37(5) of the NSCA may deal with safety significant issues, have a substantive impact on the proponent or give rise to an opportunity to be heard



Reportable Decisions - 2017

In 2017, DOs made **134 decisions** that are reportable to the Commission pursuant to subsection 37(5) of the NSCA

- 3 licence renewals with amended licence conditions
- 1 licence amendments with additional conditions
- **16** inspector order confirmations
- 1 order amendment
- 1 order revocation

- 112 licences with a financial guarantee issued by DNSR DOs
 - DNSR DOs also renewed, amended, revoked and transferred 1,609 licences with a financial guarantee



Reportable Decisions - 2018

In 2018, DOs made **99 decisions** that are reportable to the Commission pursuant to subsection 37(5) of the NSCA

2 licence renewals with amended licence conditions

- **11** inspector order confirmations
- 1 order amendment
 (More information on these decisions is in Appendix C)

- **84** licences with a financial guarantee issued by DNSR DOs
 - DNSR DOs also renewed, amended, revoked and transferred 1,472 licences with a financial guarantee
- 1 licence with a financial guarantee issued by DNCFR
 - renewal of 2 DNCFR licences with a financial guarantee



Administrative Monetary Penalties

DOs issued 7 AMPs in 2017

- 1 AMP issued by DNCFR; 6 AMPs issued by DNSR
- One recipient requested a review of the facts of the violations
 - Commission determined that the recipient had committed the violation and was required to pay the AMP

DOs issued 3 AMPs in 2018

- All 3 AMPs were issued by DNSR
- One recipient requested a review of the amount of the penalty
 - Commission determined that the amount of the penalty was calculated in accordance with regulations and that the recipient was required to pay the AMP

Summary of DO Authorities (1/2)

Licensing and certification authorities pursuant to the NSCA

- 37(2)(a): certify and decertify prescribed equipment for the purposes of the NSCA
- 37(2)(b): certify and decertify persons referred to in paragraph 44(1)(k) as qualified to carry out their duties under the NSCA or the duties of their employment, as the case may be
- 37(2)(c): issue, on receipt of an application referred to in subsection 24(2), a licence of a class established by the Commission
- 37(2)(d): renew, suspend in whole or in part, amend, revoke or replace, or authorize the transfer
 of, upon receipt of an application referred to in subsection 24(2), a licence of a class established
 by the Commission



Summary of DO Authorities (2/2)

Designation and compliance (non-licensing and certification) authorities, pursuant to the NSCA

- 37(2)(e): designate any person whom the DO considers qualified as an inspector under subsection 29(1)
- 37(2)(f): make any order that an inspector may make under subsection 35(1) or (2)
- 37(2)(g): confirm, amend, revoke or replace any order made by an inspector
- 37(2)(h): authorize the return to work of persons whose dose of radiation has or may have exceeded the prescribed radiation dose limits
- 65.05: Issue notices of violation (related to administrative monetary penalties)
