The Canadian Nuclear Association (CNA) is pleased to provide this intervention in regards to both the 2018 Regulatory Oversight Report for Uranium Mines and Mills in Canada and the 2018 Regulatory Oversight Report for Uranium and Nuclear Substance Processing Facilities in Canada.

Since 1960, CNA has been the national voice of the Canadian nuclear industry. The CNA has approximately 100 members representing over 60,000 Canadians employed directly, or indirectly, in uranium mining and exploration, fuel processing, electricity generation, and the production and advancement of nuclear medicine.

The nuclear industry is well-regulated and these reports for 2018 demonstrate that the industry continues to perform well in relation to the identified safety and control areas.
