# CNSC Designated Officer Program (1/3)

## Designated Officer Program (DO Program)

- Established in 2000 with the coming into force of the *Nuclear Safety and Control Act* (NSCA)
- The Commission may designate DOs by name, title of office or class of persons
- DOs may be authorized by the Commission to carry out licensing decisions for certain classes of licences and other duties defined in the NSCA

**The DO Program helps ensure DOs understand the scope of their authorities and how to execute them**



# CNSC Designated Officer Program (2/3)

## **DO Authorities - licensing, certification and compliance decisions**

- Licensing decisions\* including those related to the issuance, renewal, suspension, amendment, refusal, revocation or replacement of a licence
- Compliance decisions including those related to orders and Administrative Monetary Penalties (AMPs)
- Certification decisions related to prescribed equipment and personnel

*\*Excluding Class I nuclear facilities and uranium mines and mills*

# CNSC Designated Officer Program (3/3)

## DO Decision Making

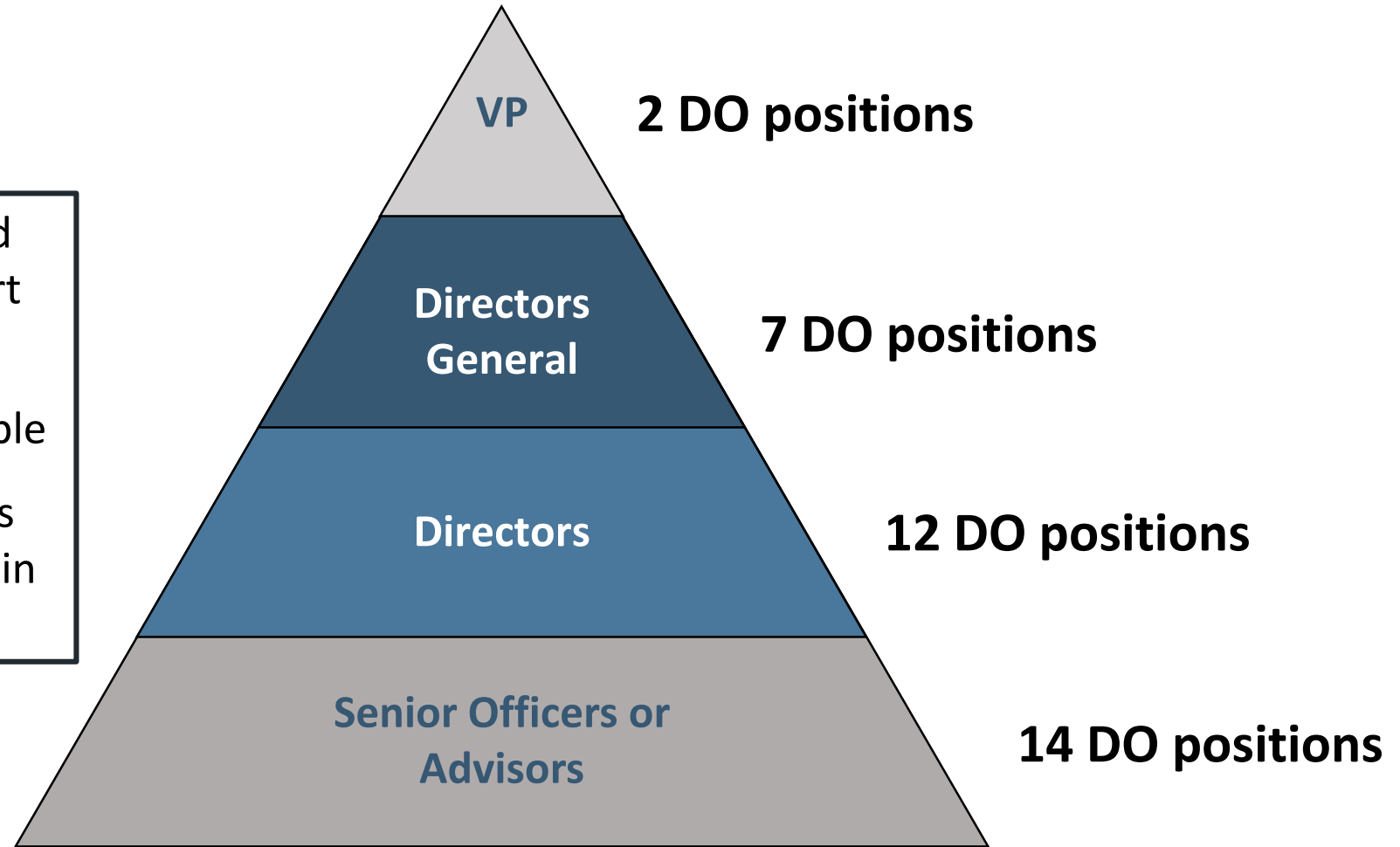
- Independent and subject to rules governing procedural fairness and impartiality
- Certain DO decisions require an opportunity to be heard
- Applicants and licensees may appeal a DO decision to the Commission
- Some decisions of DOs may be reviewed by the Commission
- Certain DO decisions have to be reported to the Commission

**DOs are independent decision makers**



# DO Positions at the CNSC (1/3)

- Senior DO positions are allocated the authorities of DOs that report to them
- DO authorities are not transferable

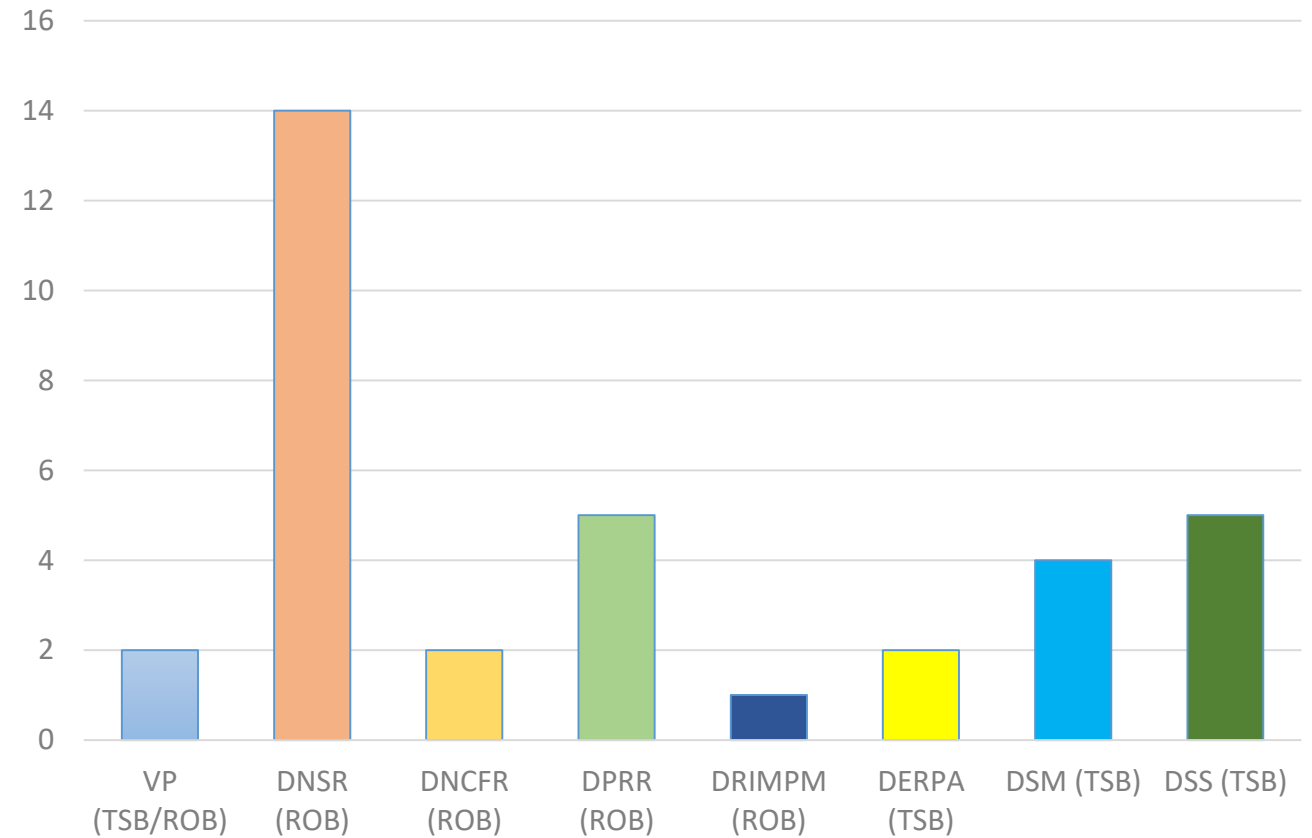


# DO Positions at the CNSC (2/3)

- 3 additional DO positions added in 2019 (CMD 19-H110)

**The Commission may designate additional DOs to address a higher volume of applications requiring DO approval**



# DO Qualifications and Training

## Qualifications:

- Those required for appointment to the designated position

## DO training and assistance program:

- Self-directed learning
- Briefings with Legal Services, the Commission Secretary, and DRIMPM
- On-the-job learning and mentorship from more experienced DOs
- Peer consultation
- DO orders training

**The DO program ensures that DOs continue to have the knowledge and tools needed to perform their duties**

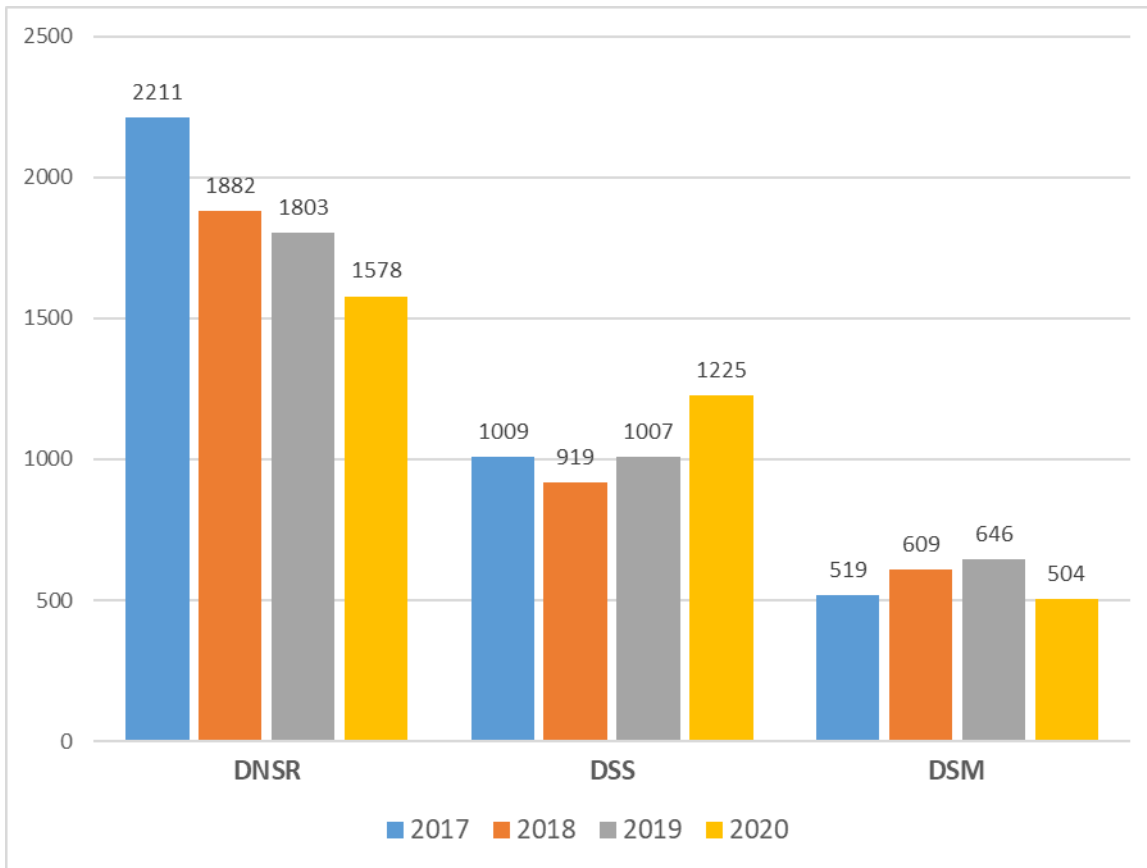

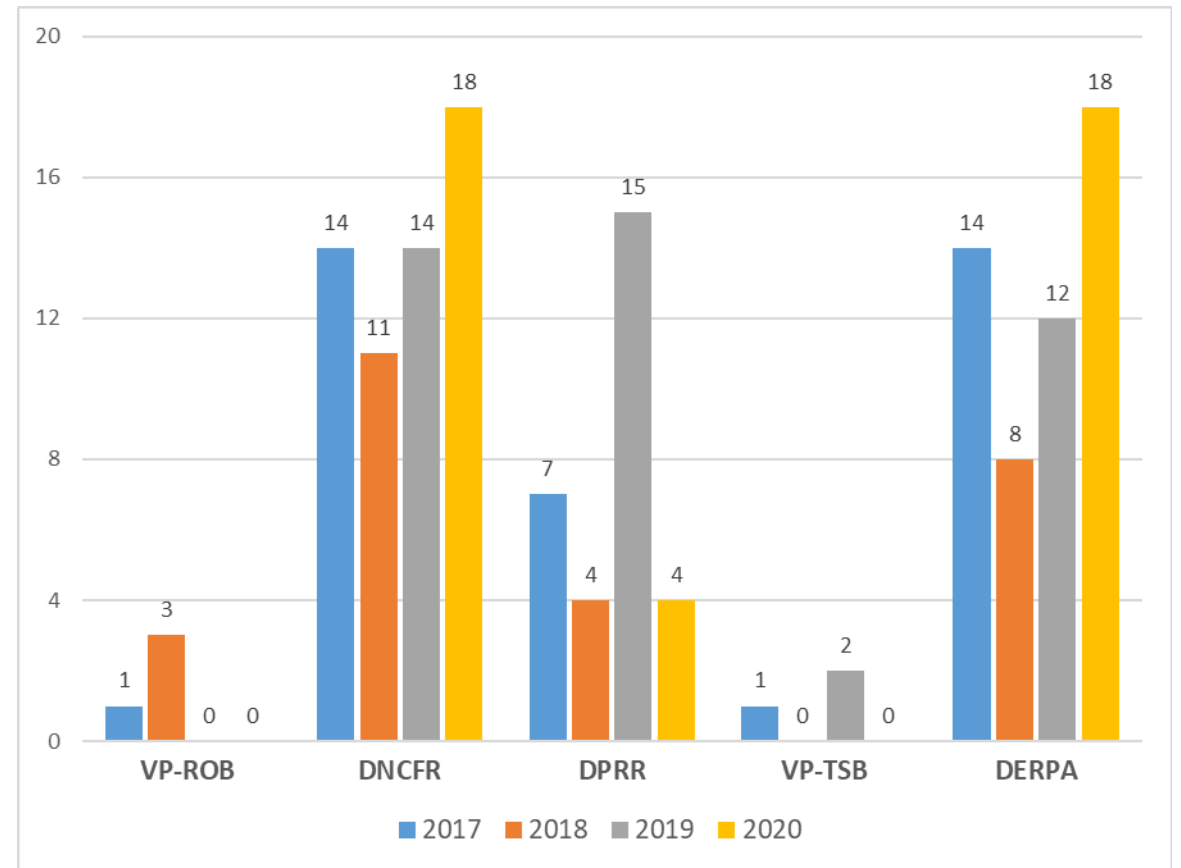


# 2020 Authorities vs Previous Years (2/2)

# Decisions Reportable to the Commission (1/2)

## The NSCA defines DO decisions that must be reported to the Commission

- This presentation is intended to fulfil this requirement for 2020
- Starting in 2021, Secretariat is also providing quarterly memos to the Commission

### Report to Commission

**(5)** A designated officer shall report to the Commission on

- (a)** a refusal by the designated officer to issue, renew, suspend, amend, revoke or replace a licence or authorize its transfer;
- (b)** the issuance by the designated officer of a licence that contains the condition that the applicant provide a financial guarantee referred to in subsection 24(5);
- (c)** a renewal of a licence where the terms or conditions of the licence are amended, or a suspension, amendment, revocation or replacement of a licence, other than an amendment of terms or conditions or a suspension, amendment, revocation or replacement made on the application, or with the consent, of the licensee; and
- (d)** a confirmation, amendment, revocation or replacement of an order under paragraph (2)(g).



# Decisions Reportable to the Commission (2/2)

In 2020, DOs made **89 decisions** reportable to the Commission

## 37(5)(a)

*Licensing refusals (including refusals to issue, renew, suspend, amend, revoke, replace, or authorize transfer)*

**4** refusals to issue a licence (Export)

## 37(5)(b)

*Issuance of a licence with a financial guarantee*

**79** licences issued with a financial guarantee

## 37(5)(c)

*Licence renewal with a change in licence conditions, or a licence suspension, amendment, revocation or replacement without an application or the licensee's consent*

**0** duties to report

## 37(5)(d)

Confirmation, amendment, revocation or replacement of an inspector's order

**6** inspector orders confirmed or amended



# Administrative Monetary Penalties

- Section 65.05 of the NSCA allows the issuance of AMPs to an individual or a corporation
  1. Individual – up to \$20,000
  2. Corporation – up to \$100,000

  - Virtual briefings with Legal Services, the Directorate of Regulatory Improvement and Major Projects Management, and the Commission Secretariat

**In 2020, DOs carried out 3,347 authorities, including 89 decisions that fall into the category of those that must be reported to the Commission.**

# Summary of DO Authorities (1/2)

## Licensing and certification authorities pursuant to the NSCA

- 37(2)(a): *certify and decertify prescribed equipment for the purposes of the NSCA*
- 37(2)(b): *certify and decertify persons referred to in paragraph 44(1)(k) as qualified to carry out their duties under the NSCA or the duties of their employment, as the case may be*
- 37(2)(c): *issue, on receipt of an application referred to in subsection 24(2), a licence of a class established by the Commission*
- 37(2)(d): *renew, suspend in whole or in part, amend, revoke or replace, or authorize the transfer of, upon receipt of an application referred to in subsection 24(2), a licence of a class established by the Commission*



# Summary of DO Authorities (2/2)

## Designation and compliance (non-licensing and certification) authorities, pursuant to the NSCA

- 37(2)(e): designate any person whom the DO considers qualified as an inspector under subsection 29(1)
- 37(2)(f): *make any order that an inspector may make under subsection 35(1) or (2)*
- 37(2)(g): *confirm, amend, revoke or replace any order made by an inspector*
- 37(2)(h): *authorize the return to work of persons whose dose of radiation has or may have exceeded the prescribed radiation dose limits*
- 65.05: *Issue notices of violation (related to administrative monetary penalties)*

## **37(5)(a)**

**4** refusals\* to issue an export licence by the Non-Proliferation and Export Controls Division.

\*On the basis that the proposed export would be inconsistent with the measures which Canada has adopted with respect to the implementation of Canada's international obligations on the non-proliferation of nuclear weapons or other nuclear explosive devices.

## **37(5)(b)**

**79** licences issued with a financial guarantee:

- **31** by the Accelerators and Class II Facilities Division
- **48** by the Nuclear Substances and Radiation Devices Division
