CNSC Designated Officer Program

- Section 37 of the Nuclear Safety and Control Act (NSCA) gives the Commission the authority to designate DOs
- The Commission may designate DOs by name, title of office, or class of persons
 - CNSC DOs are designated by title of office
 - DO Authorities include licensing, certification and compliance decisions
- DO Program formalized in 2015 and provides training and resources that:
 - Allow for consistency in issuing and tracking DO certificates
 - Support DOs in making independent, effective, consistent, and transparent decisions
 - Inform, update, and report to CNSC staff and the Commission


The DO Program exists to support DOs






2021 Authorities vs Previous Years (2/2)

Decisions Reportable to the Commission (1/2)

The NSCA specifies DO decisions that must be reported to the Commission

- This report fulfils the reporting requirements
- Starting in 2021, the Commission Registry provides quarterly memos to the Commission with timely details on reportable DO decisions

Report to Commission

- (5) A designated officer shall report to the Commission on
 - (a) a refusal by the designated officer to issue, renew, suspend, amend, revoke or replace a licence or authorize its transfer;
 - (b) the issuance by the designated officer of a licence that contains the condition that the applicant provide a financial guarantee referred to in subsection 24(5);
 - (c) a renewal of a licence where the terms or conditions of the licence are amended, or a suspension, amendment, revocation or replacement of a licence, other than an amendment of terms or conditions or a suspension, amendment, revocation or replacement made on the application, or with the consent, of the licensee; and
 - (d) a confirmation, amendment, revocation or replacement of an order under paragraph (2)(g).

Other Notable DO Authorities

Administrative Monetary Penalties (AMPs)

- Section 65.05 of the NSCA allows the issuance AMPs to an individual or a corporation
 - Up to \$20,000 for individuals and up to \$100,000 for corporations

DO Orders

- Paragraph 37(2)(f) allows authorized DOs to make orders
 - Orders made by a DO must be referred to the Commission

CNSC Import-Export Controls Program Objectives

- Enable legitimate transfer of nuclear items, nuclear-related dual-use items and risk-significant sealed sources, to be used solely for peaceful purposes
- Respect international obligations and commitments
- Implement key aspects of Canada's nuclear non-proliferation policy

Ensure exports from Canada are for peaceful uses


DO considers a range of information

- Whether the other country is party to the Nuclear Non-proliferation Treaty
- The applicability of bilateral Nuclear Cooperation Agreements
- Risk of diversion
- Nuclear weapons/explosive-related activities in the end-user country
- Utility of the item(s) to a nuclear weapon or nuclear explosive device
- End-use and end-user are legitimate
- Regulatory capability of the Importing State to provide assurances that the sources will be managed safely and securely

Nuclear and Nuclear-related Dual-use Items



Nuclear and Nuclear-related Dual-use Items




Risk-Significant Radioactive Sealed Sources



Summary of Designated Officer Authorities

Summary of DO Authorities (1/2)

Licensing and certification authorities pursuant to the NSCA

- 37(2)(a): certify and decertify prescribed equipment for the purposes of the NSCA
- 37(2)(b): certify and decertify persons referred to in paragraph 44(1)(k) as qualified to carry out their duties under the NSCA or the duties of their employment, as the case may be
- 37(2)(c): issue, on receipt of an application referred to in subsection 24(2), a licence of a class established by the Commission
- 37(2)(d): renew, suspend in whole or in part, amend, revoke or replace, or authorize the transfer of, upon receipt of an application referred to in subsection 24(2), a licence of a class established by the Commission

Summary of DO Authorities (2/2)

Designation and compliance (non-licensing and certification) authorities, pursuant to the NSCA

- 37(2)(e): designate any person whom the DO considers qualified as an inspector under subsection 29(1)
- 37(2)(f): make any order that an inspector may make under subsection 35(1) or (2)
- 37(2)(g): confirm, amend, revoke or replace any order made by an inspector
- 37(2)(h): authorize the return to work of persons whose dose of radiation has or may have exceeded the prescribed radiation dose limits
- 65.05: issue notices of violation (related to administrative monetary penalties)
