INTRODUCTION

- Lac La Ronge Indian Band (LLRIB, the Band) is one of the ten largest Bands in Canada with over 13,000 members, 6 on-reserve communities, and over 44,000 hectares of reserve lands to manage.
- LLRIB as a whole and its individual members have a profound relationship with the land and waters that is rooted in deep respect for the spiritual value of the earth and the gifts from the Creator.
- Ongoing engagement with LLRIB membership is a very important part of LLRIB operations. This is accomplished by keeping membership informed of development and providing opportunities to discuss and provide feedback on the work being done by the Band. LLRIB keeps the Protection of Treaty Rights as well as traditional and current land use by LLRIB membership at the forefront of any activity occurring within LLRIB territory and beyond.



LLRIB Participation in CNSC's Licensing Process

2019

- Notification from CNSC to LLRIB. Received and review comments submitted.

2022

- CNSC provided LLRIB with the opportunity to provide comments on the draft EIS.
- LLRIB provided review comments.
- Denison had opportunity to revise document and address comment/concerns.
- CNSC provided opportunity for LLRIB to participate in technical discussion as well as on-going discussions with LLRIB.

2024

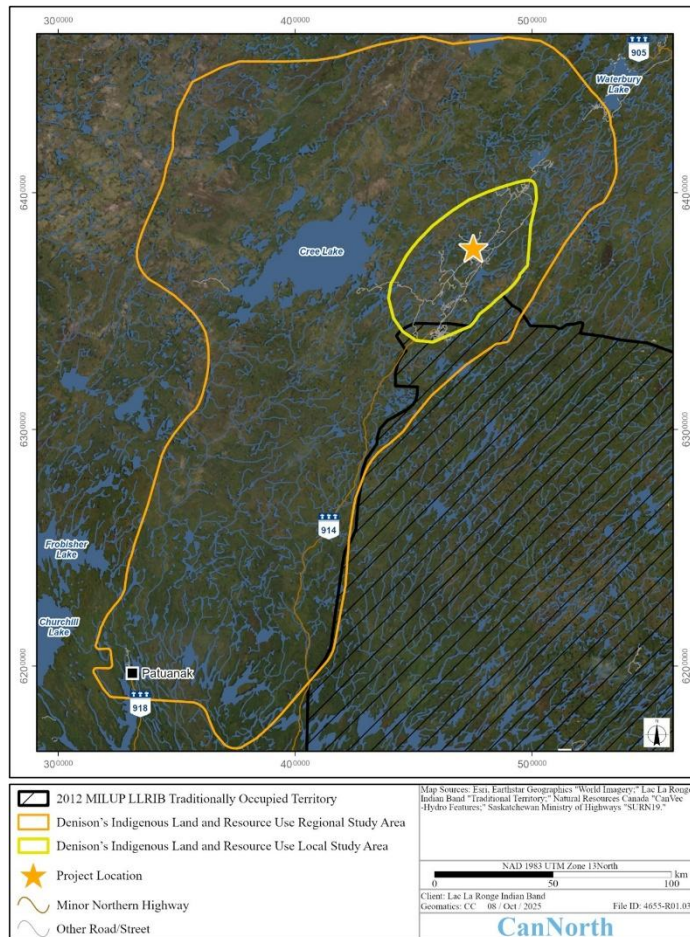
- Draft EIS activities completed, and Final EIS submitted to regulators for final review and approval.

2025

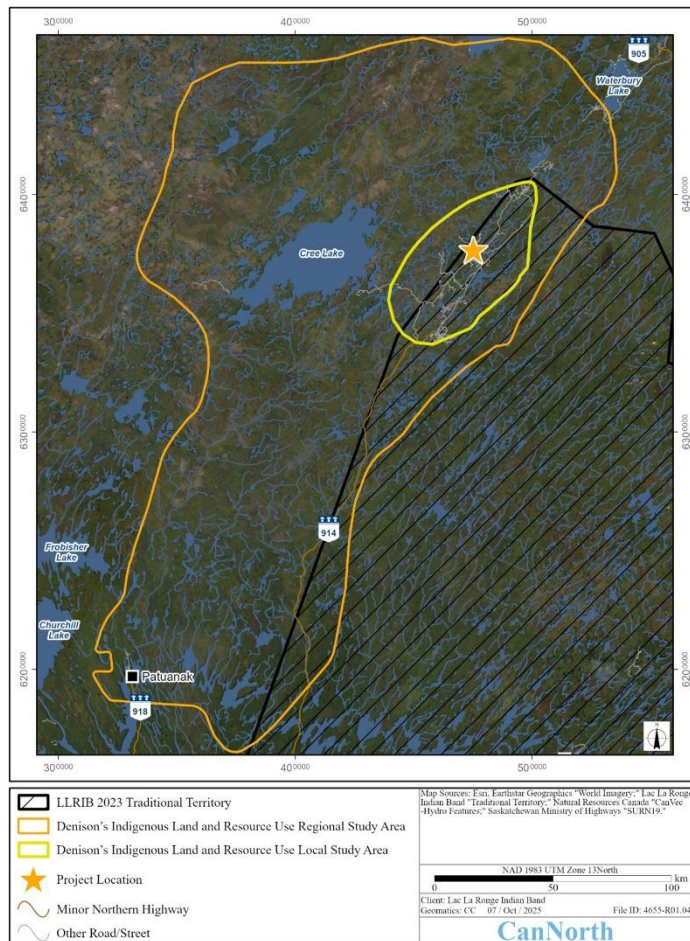
- CNSC notified LLRIB the federal review of Denisons' Final EIS had concluded and was accepted by CNSC.
- CNSC provided LLRIB with a timeline of the remaining steps of the regulatory process.

LLRIB Application Concerns/Comments

- LLRIB appreciates the engagement Denison has completed to date and affirms that the results of past engagement have been accurately described in Denison's Indigenous Engagement Report (IER). LLRIB would also like to acknowledge Denison's contributions to LLRIBs' Heritage Fund.
- Following their review of Denison's criteria to evaluate Indigenous communities', LLRIB seeks a re-evaluation of the category in which LLRIB has currently been placed in relation to the Project.
- LLRIB is currently listed in the "Other Indigenous Communities" category which is described as having a potential interest in the Project. LLRIB has assessed the Project location and various study areas presented in the EIS and deems LLRIB to instead be classified as an "Indigenous Community of Interest".
