Dear President and Commission Members,

My name is **Leonora Madjuni**, and I am a resident of **Cobourg, Ontario**. I currently work as a **Project Management Consultant supporting Cameco's Port Hope Conversion Facility (PHCF)** and have been involved in the planning and execution of capital and maintenance projects at the site.

Prior to joining Cameco as a consultant, I worked for approximately **five years with the Port Hope Area Initiative (PHAI)**, where I was involved in managing the construction and operational aspects of the **Long-Term Waste Management Facility (LTWMF)**. Through both roles, I have developed a strong understanding of the nuclear industry, regulatory requirements, environmental stewardship, and the importance of public trust.

My connection to this area extends beyond my professional career. My family and I have chosen to make Northumberland County our home, where we are raising our two daughters, aged **10 and 3**.
