

CNSC Participant Funding Program Decision

New Brunswick Power Corporation's Point Lepreau Nuclear Generating Station Licence Renewal



April 12, 2017





On September 9, 2016, the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) announced it was offering up to \$75,000 under its Participant Funding Program (PFP) to assist members of the public, Indigenous groups and other stakeholders in participating in the licence application review and Commission hearing processes for New Brunswick Power Corporation's Point Lepreau Nuclear Generating Station (PLNGS) licence renewal. The deadline for submitting participant funding applications to the CNSC was November 18, 2016.

Background

Participant funding was made available by the CNSC to:

- provide new, distinctive and valuable information to the CNSC through informed and topic-specific interventions
- assist interested parties in preparing for and participating in the Commission's public hearing process for the matter at hand

A funding review committee (FRC), independent of the CNSC, was established to review the funding applications received by the CNSC's PFP administrator, and to make recommendations to the CNSC on the allocation of up to \$75,000 for eligible applicants.

The FRC members were:

- Mr. Guy Riverin, environmental assessment expert and retired federal public servant
- Mr. Bruce Young, retired Canadian Environmental Assessment Agency Director

The CNSC received six PFP applications requesting a total of \$298,253.60, and these were reviewed by the FRC.

CNSC participant funding decision

The CNSC carefully considered the FRC's recommendations on the allocation of participant funding for the PLNGS licence renewal and approved the reimbursement of up to \$108,462.55 to the following recipients:
